Dear Resident:

Please note that this update is divided into two sections. The first section, Phase Updates, contains specific information pertaining to particular residents while the second section, Overall Updates, contains important information pertaining to all residents.

PHASE UPDATES

Interlachen Bluff & Interlachen Circle

Concrete crews will continue installing curb and gutter, concrete aprons and restoring driveways next week. While the concrete hardens you will not be able to use your driveway for 7-days, and therefore, will need to park on the street in front of your home.

Residents living on Interlachen Circle who wish to move their vehicles offsite each day may park on Merilane Avenue, and residents living on Interlachen Bluff may park on Cooper Avenue. "No Parking" signs have been posted on one side of each street because there would be insufficient room for emergency vehicles to operate. If you chose to park offsite, please keep in mind that you cannot park within 30 ft. of an intersection, or within 5 ft. of a driveway, and you will need to move your vehicles back to your street, in front of your home, by days end.

After the concrete has set for a few days, crews will begin to backfill black dirt behind the new curb. Once this is complete, you can hire a contractor to repair your irrigation system and/or pet fence. Your contractor will need to complete the repairs by late next week or the following week because the new sod will be installed in two weeks. Please ask your contractor to mark the irrigation head locations with a flag. This will help the sod crew to locate the heads and not disturb them while installing your new sod. Your contractor is to invoice the City directly by mailing invoice(s) to City of Edina, Engineering Department, 4801 W. 50th St., Edina MN, 55424, Attn: Aaron Kuznia.
