

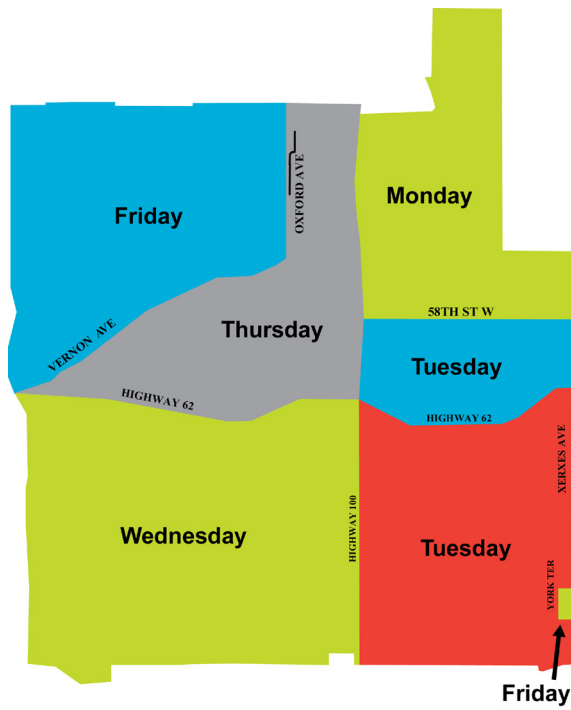

Curbside Recycling

Residential 2-Sort Recycling System

Separate your recyclables into paper sacks and place them in your recycling bin. For a complete list of recyclables, visit www.CityofEdina.com/health.



Paper Products

Put all of your paper, junk mail, newspapers, phone books, magazines, catalogs and cereal, cracker and cake boxes in a paper bag. Break down your corrugated cardboard into three-foot-by-three-foot and no larger than six-inch bundles and place in or next to your recycling bin. You can use more than one bag.



Containers

Put all of your aluminum and tin cans, glass bottles and plastic bottles together in another paper bag. You do not need separate bags for each item. Be sure to rinse your containers and remove all caps before recycling.



Items That Are Not Recyclable:

Food-Tainted Items: Food-tainted aluminum foil, plastic wrap, cups, silverware, plastic tubs, pizza boxes, coffee filters, tea bags, paper towels and napkins.

Chemically Tainted Items: Aerosol cans, paint cans, motor oil, gas containers and pens.

Bathroom/Household Items: Razors, needles, light bulbs, plastic bags, toys, dishes, medicine containers, string, cotton balls and bathroom waste paper.

Foam Items: Cups and packing materials, polystyrene.

“Waxy” Items: Milk cartons, waxed paper and drinking boxes.

Plastic Bags: Not accepted curbside, but may be dropped off at Lunds, Byerly’s, Jerry’s Foods and Cub Foods.

Hazardous Household Wastes

These types of items are NOT ACCEPTED IN THE TRASH. Bring these items to Hennepin County’s Recycling and Problem Waste Drop-Off Centers.

- Brake Fluid

- Driveway Sealers/Tars

Reduce the amount of Waste your household produces

You can reduce the amount of waste your household produces through decisions you make while shopping. Consider the following:

- Use reusable bags and look for less packaging when you shop
- Avoid disposable products: buy items designed for reuse
- Avoid one-time use packaging, such as drink boxes and juice pouches – use reusable water bottles
- Avoid non-recyclable packaging and blister packs
- Avoid mixed material packaging, such as paper laminated with plastic and/or foil
- Purchase products made from recyclables – look for recycling content packaging;
- Borrow or rent seldom used items rather than purchasing
- Purchase products that are not labeled hazardous whenever possible

Hopefully, these suggestions can impact the amount of waste that is put in the trash and increase materials that can be recycled.
